The Third Commandment: You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

The Third Commandment teaches us that we should not use God's name in a disrespectful way. We should not swear or curse, and we should not

use His name in a frivolous manner.

Story: A man named Uzzah was once helping to transport the Ark of the Covenant. When the oxen pulling the cart stumbled, Uzzah reached out to steady the Ark. God was angry with Uzzah for touching the Ark, and He struck him dead.

Example: We can obey the Third Commandment by using God's name respectfully. We can do this by not swearing or cursing, and by not using His name in a frivolous manner.

The Fourth Commandment: Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

The Fourth Commandment teaches us that we should set aside one day each week to rest and worship God. We should not work on the Sabbath, and we should use this day to spend time with family and friends, and to pray and read the Bible.


