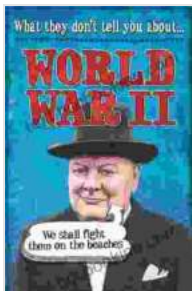

The horizontal stripes represent the original 13 Colonies

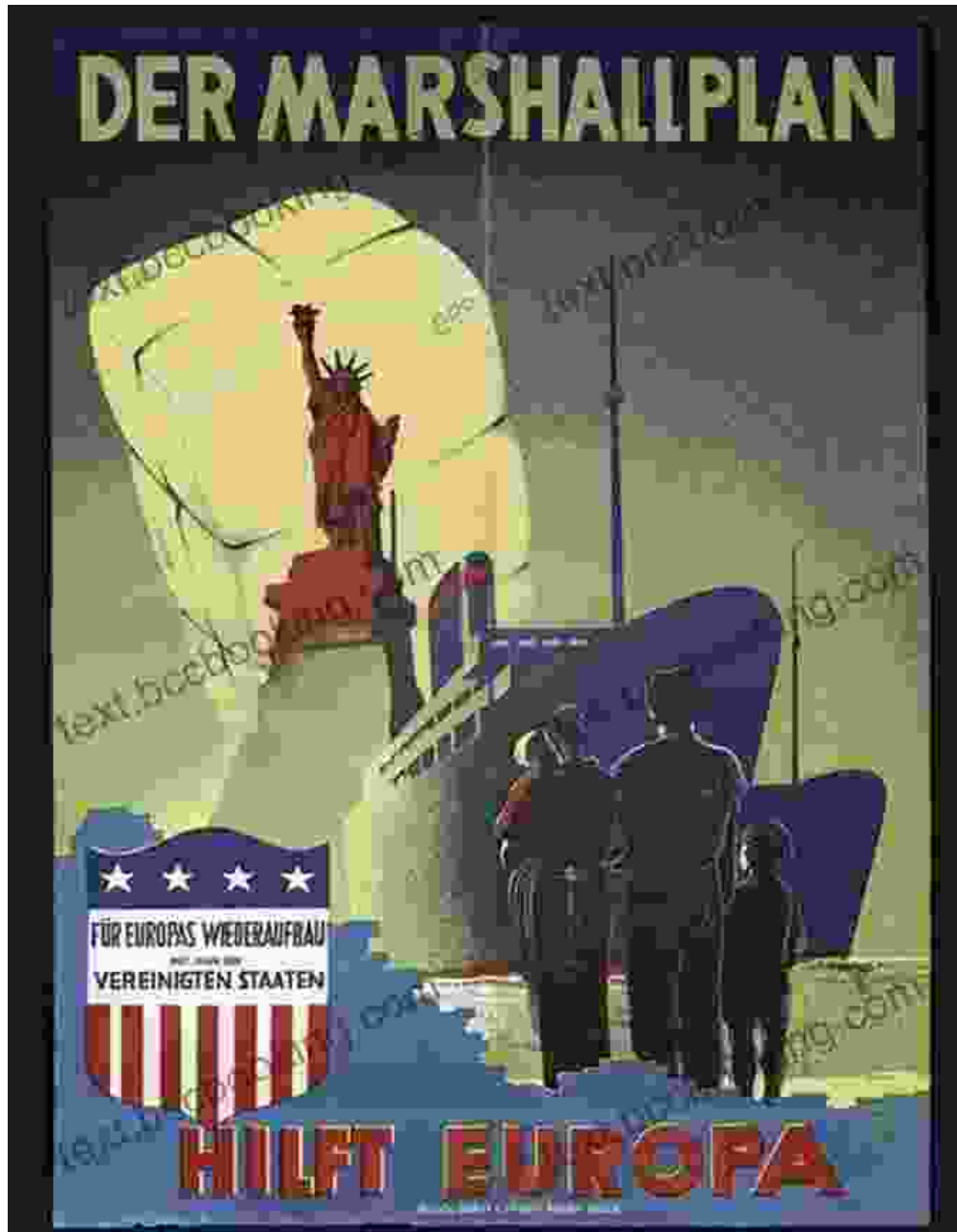
— There are 7 red stripes. Red symbolizes hardiness and valor

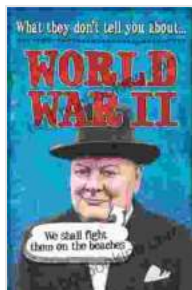

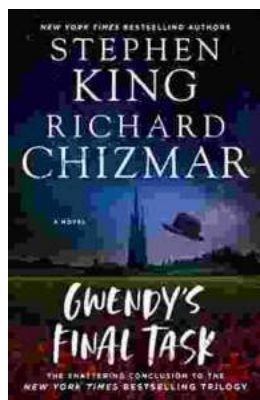

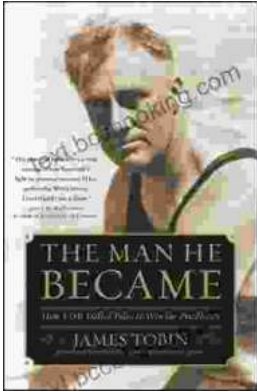
